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ROLE SUMMARY

The main purpose of the role includes having fun through Football with a talk on a biblical value such as self-control for example which can be applied through Football. The Kick Leader will send out a rota requesting volunteers' availability along with a Kick session plan that includes the value for that week. A Coaching Drill and guidance on the talk. Arrangements and preparations will be made via a What's App Group to confirm who will be allocated a certain duty. Be it the warm-up, The Coaching Drill or the talk.

Carrying equipment from a designated cupboard to a grass area before assembling goals check the area by cleaning up any dog mess or fox scat along with broken glass or anything that could pose a risk to children before marking out a Football Pitch and/or area for training drills using cones.

Meet 9.15am on Saturday mornings during the school term at St Saviours Church on Finsen Road Herne Hill where you can meet with the Project Leader who will have keys and access to a Cupboard where equipment is stored before lifting and transporting the equipment to Ruskin Park where the activity takes place

A First Aid Kit will be provided along with an accident report book in the event of an injury. Even If you are unsure of anything you notice relating to safeguarding and the wellbeing of children it is still very important to communicate any concerns
